






# 1. At a glance

## Baby (camera) unit






- 1. Camera
- 2. Desk stand
- 3. Speaker
- 4. Antenna
- 5. Power jack


#### Power / Linking LED indicator Lights up in blue when the parent unit

is powered on and linked to the baby (camera) unit.

#### 7. Pair button

Press and hold to pair with the parent unit.





- 1. Screen display
- 2. Dual sound level indications (front and top view)
- Power button Press and hold to turn on or off. Press to turn the screen on or off.
- 4. Menu button Press to open the menu.
- 5. OK / Zoom button

Press to confirm a selection/zoom in or out.

6. Navigation button


Pan or tilt the camera to different directions/adjust menu settings/ press left or right to select the parent unit's volume level.

- 7. Volume / Back button
- Talk back button Press and hold to talk to the baby.
- 9. Antenna
- 10. Speaker

# 2. Connect and charge

## Baby (camera) unit




- Plug the DC plug of the power adapter into the power socket on the rear of the baby (camera) unit and plug the other end of the AC adapter into the wall socket.
- 2. The baby unit turns on and the power indicator lights up in blue and blinks in red after 30 seconds if the parent unit has not been powered up.

Strangulation Hazard. Children have STRANGLED in cords. Keep this cord out of the reach of children (more than 1 meter or 3 feet away). Do not remove the tags from the AC Adapters. Only use the AC Adapters provided.

#### Parent unit



A rechargeable battery is already pre-installed inside the parent unit. When fully charged, you can move the parent unit without losing the link and picture from the baby (camera) unit. When charging the battery for the first time, charge for at least 16 hours continuously.

- Plug the DC plug of the power adapter into the power socket on the side of the parent unit and plug the other end of the AC adapter into the wall socket.
- 2. Switch on the AC power and the parent unit will turn on.
- When the parent unit is fully charged, i will appear steadily on the screen display.
- 4. Press and hold the power button on the top of the parent unit to turn it on and off.


#### Note

Use only the supplied power adapter (DC5V / 1500 mA).

# Pair the baby (camera) unit to the parent unit

We have paired the baby unit to the parent unit in the pack. In case you want to pair an extra camera, press and hold *(*) on the rear of the baby (camera) unit until the voice prompt **'Ready for pairing'** is heard.

# 3. Wall mount the baby (camera) unit



- 1. Mark the positions of 2 screw holes on the wall. Drill a screw hole at each marking.
- 2. Install the supplied wall anchors into 2 screw holes on the wall.
- 3. Insert the supplied wall mounting screws into the wall anchors.
- 4. Remove the desk stand by loosening the screw on the underside of the desk stand.
- 5. Fix and fasten this screw on the baby (camera) unit and the wall mount bracket.
- 6. Hang the wall mount bracket on the wall mounting screws on the wall.

#### Note

The pack includes a power adapter with a longer cord which is beneficial for wall mount application, where your wall socket is far from the camera.

## Other menu options

#### Lullabies playback

- 1. Press **MENU** on the parent unit to open the  $\overline{22}$  menu.
- 2. Scroll the navigation button to 🞵 then press **OK** and view the names of lullabies displaying on the screen.
- 3. Select a desired lullaby then press **OK** to start playback.

## Audio book playback

- 1. Press **MENU** on the parent unit to open the 🔀 menu.
- 2. Scroll the navigation button to []] then press **OK** and view the names of audio books displaying on the screen.
- 3. Select a desired audio book then press **OK** to start playback.

### Personal recording playback

- 1. Press **MENU** on the parent unit to open the  $\overline{22}$  menu.
- 2. Scroll the navigation button to  ${f Q}$ .
- 3. Select the personal recording then press **OK** to start playback.

#### Note

The personal recording is only available when you have recorded your personal sound through the Motorola Nursery App.

# Adjust the volume level of audio playback (lullabies, audio book and personal recording)

- 1. Press **MENU** on the menu bar of the parent unit to open the  $\overline{12}$  menu.
- 2. Scroll the navigation button to  ${\bf U}$  then press  ${\bf OK}$  and the volume status bar pops up.
- 3. Select a desired volume level, then press **OK** to confirm.

# 5. View the baby through your device

#### Minimum system requirement

- Android™ System: Version 7.0 or above
- iPhone\*/iPad\* iOS: Version 10.0 or above
- High Speed (Wi-Fi\*) Internet: At least 0.6 Mbps upload bandwidth per camera (you can test your internet speed on this site: http://www. speedtest.net).

 Scan the QR code with your smart device and download the Motorola Nursery App from App Store for iOS devices or from Google Play<sup>™</sup> Store for Android<sup>™</sup> devices.

- 2. Install the App on your device.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to run and sign up or log in to the App.
- 4. Open the Motorola Nursery App on your compatible smartphone or tablet.
- Follow the in-app instructions to create your account and connect to your device.



# 6. Help

#### No display

- Try recharging the battery pack.
- Reset the parent and baby (camera) units. Unplug both units from the wall socket, then plug them back in.
- Check if the parent/baby (camera) unit is powered on.
- When operated by the battery only, the parent unit display will go blank after 5 minutes, 30 minutes or 60 minutes to save power (depending on video settings).

#### The baby (camera) unit has lost its link with the parent unit

- The baby (camera) unit is too far away and may be out of range. Move the it closer to the parent unit.
- Disconnect both the parent and baby (camera) units from the power outlet. Wait for about 15 seconds and reconnect them. Allow up to one minute for the parent and baby (camera) units to synchronize.

#### Noise interference on your parent unit

- Make sure there is at least 3 to 6 feet between the parent and baby (camera) units to avoid audio feedback.
- The baby (camera) unit is too far away and may be out of range. Move the it closer to the parent unit.
- Make sure the parent and baby (camera) units are not placed near other electrical equipment, such as a television, computer or cordless/mobile telephone. Move the parent and baby (camera) units 5 feet away from other electrical equipment.
- Use of other 2.4 GHz products, such as wireless networks (Wi- Fi\* routers), Bluetooth™ systems, or microwave ovens, may cause interference with this product.
- If the signal is weak, try moving the parent and/or baby (camera) units to different positions in rooms.

#### Lost connection

 Check your Wi-Fi<sup>\*</sup> settings and reconnect your Wi-Fi<sup>\*</sup> if necessary. Ensure the baby (camera) unit is switched on. Wait for a few minutes for the baby (camera) unit to connect with the Wi-Fi<sup>\*</sup> system.

This Limited Warranty is your exclusive warranty and is not transferable.

## Who is covered?

This warranty extends only to the first consumer purchaser, and is not transferable.

## What will MZGW do?

MZGW or its authorized distributor at its option and within a commercially reasonable time, will at no charge repair or replace any Products or Accessories that do not conform to this limited warranty. We may use functionally equivalent reconditioned / refurbished / pre-owned or new Products, Accessories or parts.
